Digitalization and access in Internet.**

Primary (direct) goals of that project are:

- to digitize the most precious items from largest antique collection in Poland,
- to provide access to digitized materials for all interested persons,
- to provide access to full information related with digitized materials about past of Lower Silesia region, including presentation of history and cultural heritage.

By completing primary goals of the project also secondary (indirect) goals will be completed:

- preservation of cultural heritage,
- popularization of history and antiques of Lower Silesia region,
- improvement of information regarding regional tourist attractions,
- increase accessibility of information regarding cultural resources of region,

including the most important – more efficient usage of cultural heritage objects and support for cultural institution's activities that will increase tourist and cultural offer and in this way – will also increase region's attractiveness on domestic and foreign market.

In the framework of this project:

- modern equipment to digitize historical collections was purchased, including: A2 + scanner, A3 + scanner, the set for a safe digitization of collections hard to open;
- the server and disk array of effective capacity exceeding 300 TB were purchased;
- 1100 medieval manuscripts and numerous old prints, maps, music items, silesiaca and lusatica, which are most valuable parts of the largest historical collection in Poland were digitized
- 320 items were restored, including a large number of medieval manuscripts
- 404 000 files, being result of cultural heritage digitization process, are available in public domain in Internet on the basis of equal and free access
